



### **CHERKOWSKI'S** CHERISH **COCA-COLA CLASSIC**

Having made great strides since skating in the Vernon Classic Pee Wee Hockey Tournament, Nick and Anne Cherkowski now stand as examples of what today's crop of young local players can achieve in the sport.

The 2020 Classic takes place Feb. 13-16, and as the cover athletes for the tournament, the two local siblings have nothing but fond recollections of playing on the biggest stage in town for Pee Wee players.

"Growing up in Vernon it's just a cool tournament to be a part of, and to play in it is still something I'll never forget," said Nick, who played in the tournament in 2013.

Plaving for the Junior A Vipers was the dream of Nick's growing up in the city - a dream he realized when he played his first game with the big team in the 2017/18 BCHL season.

The 23-year-old went on to play his first full season with the Vipers the following year, notching two goals and 13 points in 54 games.

This year has been one of changes for Nick. He was traded two the Wenatchee Wild three games into the season, and then again to the Chilliwack Chiefs 24 games later.

"It's definitely been kind of a whirlwind season for sure, but I've enjoyed kind of getting used to new towns, new hockey markets and living away from home," he said

Next year will require an even bigger adjustment, as he has committed to Merrimack College in the U.S.

"About middle of October I went down to Boston to tour the campus and see how the school works and the hockey program that they have there," Nick explained. "I just kind of fell in love and I knew it was the spot for me."

As he prepares himself for the next stage of his hockey career, Nick still remembers the feeling he had at the Classic, which more many young players is the first taste of the hockey spotlight.

"There's a little bit of buzz around the tournament and it's fun, you kind of feel like a superstar," he said,





His advice to this year's players is simple: "Just take it all in."

Meanwhile, younger sister Anne Cherkowski was busy soaking up the buzz at the Women's World Under 18 Hockey Championships in Slovakia from late December to early January. It was her second year competing with Canada at the international showcase, and the 17-year-old left with a silver medal around her neck.

"That was definitely something I will never forget," Anne said of the experience. "Even just travelling around and seeing a whole new part of the world and being able to do it while playing hockey is something that I think is really special."

Anne, like her brother, is college-bound having committed to the University of Minnesota - a hockey school through and through.

"I always wanted to be in a spot that had the best facilities, best team, best environment to grow and so I think Minnesota really fit that for me," she said.

Anne won't be eligible for next year's World Under-18s, but she's not finished vying for a spot with Team Canada.

"Think definitely the Olympics is a huge (goal) for me. I've always dreamed of that as a little kid."

As a kid she also spent countless hours playing ball hockey with her brother in their basement, and well beyond those formative years Nick continues to guide her by example.

"He definitely had a huge impact on my hockey career," Anne said. he's super dedicated, super driven, the most hard-working person ever, so I think that is something I just look up to every day."

Anne says she never expected to one day represent the Classic, but she knows it wouldn't have happened without a deep passion for the sport from an early age.

"We didn't really think things would turn out like this, we just kind of played the sport because we love the sport, and I guess growing up having each other to push each other and build off of that ... really drove us to be where we are now."

### GENUINE HOCKEY MOM 'WAS A PRETTY SPECIAL LADY'

Fantastic baker. Green-thumb goddess. Grandma on the go. Hockey mom extraordinaire.

Tributes are pouring in for the matriarch of one of Vernon's bestknown hockey families.

Adeline Victoria Holland - who went by Lee or Lena - died Friday at age 87.

Her late husband, Rienie, was a fixture in the scorekeeper's box at the old Vernon Civic Arena during Vernon Lakers' games.

He was also the founder of the annual Coca Cola Classic Vernon Winter Carnival Pee Wee Hockey Tournament, with a volunteer award presented in his name at each tournament.

Her oldest son, Ken, is the general manager of the NHL's Edmonton Oilers, and youngest son Dennis is an NHL scout for the Dallas Stars.


"Our mom was a pretty special lady," said middle child Diane Bowers, who, like her parents, spent many hours at the Civic Arena helping out or watching her brothers play.

"Her health had really declined so we're happy she is at peace now and pain-free.

Born on March 21, 1932, at Mabel Lake, Holland met her future husband at a baseball field by the lake.

They married June 20, 1953, and lived in Golden at a logging camp where Holland worked as a cook and Rienie was a logger.

When Rienie got a job with BC Hydro, the couple moved to Vernon.



Predominantly a stay-at-home mom, Holland was a cook at the Vernon Army Camp in the summer months.

She also volunteered at and helped run the Civic Arena concession for the City of Vernon, worked for a jewelry store and picked apples at local farms.

"At home, she was an amazing baker and cook, and a fantastic gardener," said Holland's granddaughter Karlee Bowers, one of Holland's eight grandchildren as well as five great-grandkids (two more on the way in 2020).

"Grandma literally never sat down. She was always on the go, trying to get more food for others or cleaning something.

"Often at dinner, she would say

to us, 'Do you need anything?' And we'd say, 'We just need you to sit down."

It wasn't only the grandkids who lived for Holland's baking but her kids' friends as well. Besides her legendary cinnamon buns, brownies, pies and cinnamon bread, Karlee called Holland "the absolute best hostess – you literally couldn't walk into her house without her offering some food she had made."

Troy Mick, long-time best friend of Dennis Holland – the pair starred in Vernon Minor Hockey together and with the Western Hockey League's Portland Winter Hawks said his heart was broken over the death of a woman he called "a second mom."

"Heaven gained a beautiful soul," Mick said. "Words cannot describe

how important of a role model she was to me growing up. She was just an amazing human being.

"She was always driving Dennis and I to all of the sports we played and made the best damn cookies ever. I thank her for the unconditional love she gave me alwavs."

Karlee Bowers said that even though she and her sister never lived in the same city as their beloved grandmother, Holland had a special way of building a solid and supportive relationship with them

"She called us all the time, sent us letters and cards and gift cards for every occasion," Karlee said. "Grandma had such a fantastic sense of humour, she was always up for a good laugh."



#### "A" DIVISION TROPHY - AMY MYLES TROPHY

Best known for her untiring work with the Vernon & District Minor Hockey Association, Mrs. Myles was a familiar figure around the arena for over 15 years. She was one of the first mothers to start the "Mothers' Auxiliary to Minor Hockey". In April 1965, Minor Hockey said "thank you" to Mrs. Myles by presenting her with a Life Membership in the association. In 1968 the CAHA presented her with a Scroll of Merit in recognition of her outstanding service and dedication to hockey and to the physical and mental development of young Canadians.

Born in Ontario, she moved to Vernon with her husband Dan after the Second World War. She is survived by her husband Dan and one son and daughter.

Amy Myles was a true and great friend to all who knew her.

#### **"B" DIVISION TROPHY - ALEX KULY TROPHY**

Born and raised in Portage La Prairie, Manitoba, Alex Kuly played some of his Junior Hockey with Portage La Prairie Terriers. He then moved to the Flin Flon Bombers defence.

During the war he served in the Air Force as a physical education instructor and later returned to play defence for the Flin Flon Bombers. He moved to play defence for Kamloops, and to Vernon where he coached for one season.

He was the head referee for the Okanagan Mainline Minor Hockey Association until he was transferred to Quesnel as the Forest Ranger. While in Quesnel he coached the Quesnel Kangaroos. He returned to Vernon in 1961 where he was a strong supporter of Minor Hockey.


#### "C" DIVISION TROPHY - MICKEY MCMAHON TROPHY

In 1952, he helped the Vernon Juveniles Hockey Club to win the B.C. Championship in Trail. In 1953, he played for the Juvenile Lacrosse team, coached by the late Ben Douglas and they won the B.C. Juvenile Championship, defeating New Westminister at the coast. In 1954, he was catcher for Nick's Aces softball team (fastpitch) and won the B.C. Senior "B" Championship in Aldergrove. In 1956, the Vernon Junior Hockey team won the B.C. Championship in Victoria with Mickey as a team member. He was head referee for the North Okanagan Hockey League and in the summer he umpired senior baseball games throughout the valley. His two daughters are carrying on his athletic traditions. Mickey passed away October 18, 1981.



#### DAN OXNARD TROPHY - MOST SPORTSMANLIKE TEAM

Dan Oxnard was born in Lytton, B.C. August 1944 and moved to Vernon in 1966. He was a professional firefighter for the Vernon Fire Department for 28 years. Dan gave a great deal of his time off helping raise money for Muscular Dystrophy and the B.C. Burn Unit. He got involved in Minor Hockey in 1975 where he spent 12 years coaching, managing teams or holding down executive positions as Director, Vice President and President.

If there was a job to be done Dan was always there to help. Dan joined the Pee Wee Hockey tournament committee in 1985, spending the next 8 years making it the success it is today.

Dan died in a skiing accident in January 1995. Dan is survived by his wife Darlene, daughter Tanis and son Dano. He is missed by all who knew him.



#### ERNIE KOWAL TROPHY - COACH'S AWARD

Ernie Kowal was active in Junior A and minor hockey in Vernon since moving to the city in 1958. 'Esso Ernie' served as a coach, manager, vice-president and president in the Vernon Minor Hockey Association and was an owner with the Vernon Essos of the B.C. Junior Hockey League.

A volunteer firefighter and former member of the RCMP Auxiliary force, Ernie died December 12, 1997 at the age of 63. He is survived by his wife Viv, son Tom (now an NHL referee) and daughter Sue. Ernie and his brother-in-law, Vern Dye, ran the Junior A franchise in Vernon for more than 20 years and the two men used their own vehicles to transport players on road trips.

Ernie coached the juvenile Reps in 1983 and made national headlines with a no swearing policy on the team. He was named provincial coach-of-the-year in 1985 after he and Tom led the Vernon Atom Reps to the Okanagan title.



#### **RIENIE HOLLAND TROPHY - VOLUNTEER AWARD**

Rienie joined the committee three years after the tournament began. He serviced as the ice ambassador for minor hockey, was a division manager as well as serving on the executive board. He was also a fixture in the scorekeeper's box at the old Vernon Civic Arena during Vernon Lakers' games.

He was involved with minor Baseball and served as a umpire and division manager.

Rienie's oldest son, Ken, is the general manager of the NHL's Edmonton Oilers and is one of the most successful general managers in league history winning the Stanley Cup four times with the Detroit Red Wings. Rienie's youngest son Dennis, is an NHL scout for the Dallas Stars. In the 1978 NHL Entry Draft, Dennis was drafted by the Detroit Red Wings in round 3 #52 overall.



Brayden Hickling had no problem being part of an impromptu North American Free Trade Agreement Sunday morning in Vernon.

Hickling, a 12-year-old forward with the California Wave pee wee hockey team, in the North Okanagan for the 48th annual Vernon Winter Carnival Coca Cola Classic Pee Wee Hockey tournament, was dealt by the Wave, along with two teammates, including a goalie, to Canada's Yellowknife Wolfpack right before the D Event battle for the Mickey Ogasawara Trophy.

The Wave had played four games before their players (and their families) had to return to California, leaving them with just eight players for the D final.

The Wolfpack, who lost last year's A Event Amy Myles Trophy final to the host Watkin Motors Mustangs, said, 'No problem. We'll play a fun game.'

Hence the trading of players. There was the white-jerseyed Wolfpack, with the Wave additions, wearing Yellowknife jerseys but California team socks, playing the dark-jerseyed Wave, with Yellowknife additions wearing their road jerseys.



"It was awesome to meet all of those (Yellowknife) kids. They're really nice," said a beaming Hickling, from Anaheim, Cal., post-shower. "They were all welcoming. It was amazing."

And speaking of amazing, that was the exact word Hickling's Wave teammate Matt Duggan used to describe a team outing while in Vernon: a little shinny on the outdoor rink at the Vernon Recreation Centre. Something that's pretty much impossible to do in Southern California.

"That was pretty awesome. It was snowing, cold, just amazing," said Duggan, who's been to Canada once before with his dad to visit the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto. The closest thing the Wave have to outdoor shinny is a roller hockey rink by the beach.

"I didn't want to come off (at the outdoor rink). We were there for almost three hours," added Hickling, who has been to the Okanagan before, taking part in the Okanagan Hockey School in Penticton in the summer. "My face

There were smiles, hugs and handshakes everywhere as both teams gathered for a group picture.

The Wolfpack, really, are the tournament's (and possibly pee wee hockey) goodwill ambassadors. A year ago at the Classic, they became fast friends with another California visiting team, the San Diego Saints.

"We developed a really good friendship with the team last year and, in the spirit of friendship and hockey, we invited them up to Yellowknife last March," said Wolfpack team manager Sarah Dennis.

"We did a whole bunch of different activities with them from dog sledding to ice fishing, snowmobiling, a night of traditional games, took them out to see the Aurora Village (viewing the Northern Lights), then we had some exhibition games, about four of them, between Yellowknife and San Diego. At the last game we mixed up the teams similar to what happened here today."

For Wada, attending his second Coca Cola Classic. Sunday's experience just adds to why the Vernon tournament is one of his favourites.






