Robinson a natural-born leader

Natural-born leader. Check-till-ya-drop effort every shift. Responsible two-way forward.

Now a rotating captain with the Chilliwack Bruins of the Western Hockey League, Dave Robinson has been a complete player since his days with the Watkin Motors Mustangs.

The Vernon minor hockey grad, who turned 19 on Feb. 6, has fond memories of his Vernon Coca-Cola Pee Wee Classic experience.

"I remember we had one of the better teams in the round-robin and we needed to beat Saanich, but we lost to Saanich, in overtime, and that knocked us out of the playoffs; we didn't even make it to the semifinals," said Robinson.

The grandson of the late Vern Dye, a founder of the B.C. Junior Hockey League, Robinson played alongside Kris Glinsbockel and Taylor Bourgeois with

the Mustangs. His coaches were Keith Chase and Mike Kakoske.

"It was the highlight of my career up until that point. We were in the Winter Carnival parade, we got bags (equipment) and we were in the paper. It was a pretty huge deal to us then. They run it like a Midget tournament, with a banquet."

The feisty 5-foot-10, 170-pounder compiled 15 points and 117 penalty minutes in 71 games as a rookie with Chilliwack. As of late January this season, he had eight goals and 13 points in 51 games.

The Bruins chose Robinson to serve as captain when Jadon Potter went down with a season-ending injury before the midway mark.

"It was surreal at first, being asked to be a captain at 18, but I've had some experience being captain, in Bantam and Midget Quad, so I didn't change my game. I try to lead by example and say a little extra in the dressing room if I feel I need to."

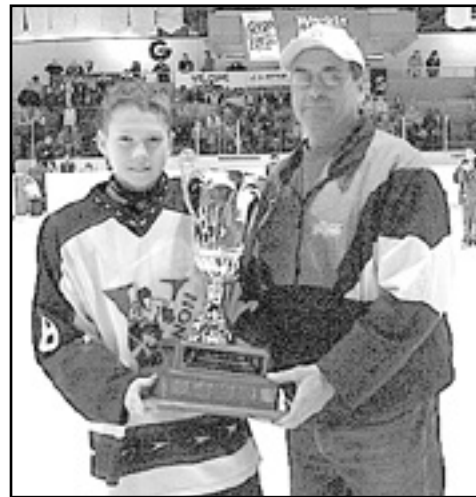

The Prince George Viking Construction Pee Wee Tier1 Cougars represent the city of Prince George (population 80,000). The Clippers Pee Wee Tier 1 team is from Nanaimo, a city of 80,000 on Vancouver Island. Last year's team represented the Island in the AAA provincial championships. This year's team is comprised of 14 second-year players, and three first-year players. The Clippers were 24-11-4 in mid December. The Clippers convincingly won this year's Comox Tier 1 tournament in November. The last time this group was together, they won both the league and playoff banners (Atom 2006/2007). They finished that season ranked fourth in the province by *BC Hockey Now*. The Clippers have a hard-checking, puck possession style. They take pride in their physical play, and strong work ethic. However, good sportsmanship and teamwork are heavily emphasized by the coaching staff and the players; their motto is "Team First". The Boatmen are led by renowned coach Zed Malenica who also heads up the local Hockey Canada Skills Academy. In addition to local tournaments and the Coca-Cola Classic this year, the Clippers competed in the top division of the Toast of the Coast tournament in Valencia California where they finished second overall.

Ernie Kowal was active in Junior A and minor hockey in Vernon since moving to the city in 1958.

'Esso Ernie' served as a coach, manager, vice-president and president in the Vernon Minor Hockey Association and was an owner with the Vernon Essos of the B.C. Junior Hockey League.

A volunteer firefighter and former member of the RCMP Auxiliary Force, Ernie died Dec. 12, 1997 at the age of 63. He is survived by his wife Viv, son Tom (now an NHL referee) and daughter Sue.

Ernie and his brother-in-law, Vern Dye, ran the Junior A franchise in Vernon for more than 20 years and the two men used their own vehicles to transport players on road trips.

Ernie coached the juvenile Reps in 1983 and made national headlines with a no-swearing policy on the team. He was named provincial coach-of-the-year in 1985 after he and Tom led the Vernon Atom Reps to the Okanagan title.

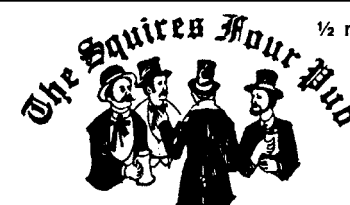

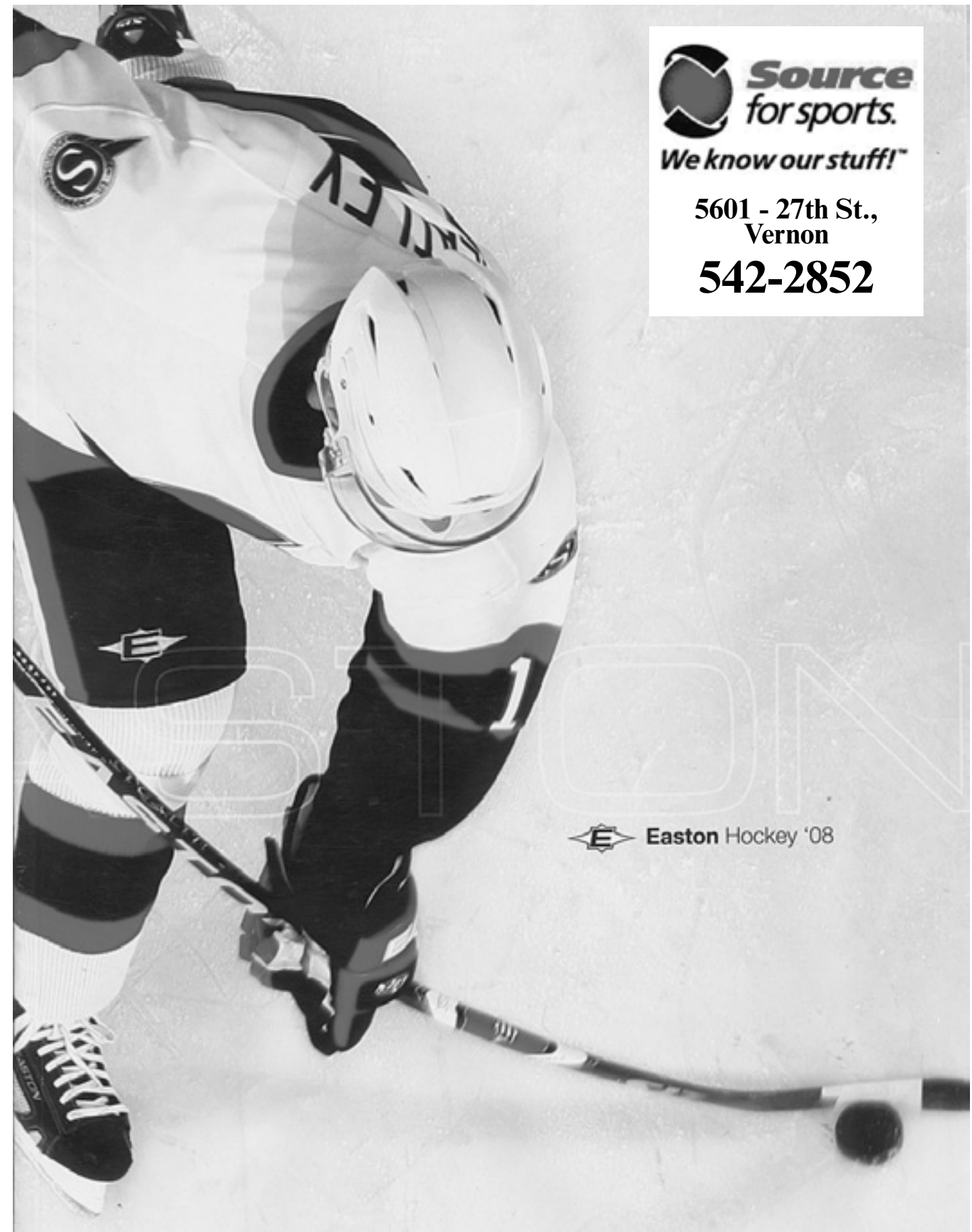
