MUSTANGS ALUM RELISH TOURNAMENT MEMORIES

Neither one got to experience a tournament championship. Neither one got to kiss Queen Silver Star as captain. Both got to play against players who would become NHL regulars.

But for former Vernon Watkin Motors Mustangs teammates Cole Woodliffe and Blaine Caton, the Vernon Winter Carnival Coca Cola Classic Pee Wee Hockey Tournament remains one of the best memories of their young lives. Both played two years for the Mustangs, and were in two Classic events.

"I remember all the commotion around how big of a tournament it was," said Woodliffe, who turns 22 on Feb. 10 – the date of the four division finals of the this year's tournament.

"I remember meeting the teams, going to the banquet and seeing everybody that was playing. It seemed like a very prestigious event. I remember feeling very VIP-like, having your own dressing room. We got to use the midget rep's dressing room."

Said Caton, 21: "Just the history of the tournament in Vernon, and how big of a deal it is for the younger kids. It's like your Stanley Cup when you're that age. Every team got a new bag. It's like the best time of year with the Carnival and the parade going on, then the tournament. When you're that old, you're not used to playing in front of that many people so it's pretty cool."

The Classic always brings about large crowds from the community, particularly the feature opening game Thursday night following the opening ceremonies. Woodliffe and Caton were 1-1 in feature games, losing 9-2 to the Burnaby Winter Club in their first year in 2009 – The Winter Club lineup featured current NHL all-star Matt Barzal of the New York Islanders and former Vernon Vipers forward Nic Rasovic – then beat the Cowichan Valley Capitals 10-0 in 2010.

"I remember on that night being called out onto the ice, do a lap, then you're standing out there on the ice, witnessing Queen Silver Star, listening to people

give speeches," said Woodliffe. "All the other teams are on the ice, that's something you don't usually participate in, particularly at that age, then you're playing in front of a crowd at that capacity at that age, you're kind of starstruck. You try to focus on the game, and the crowd's loud, everyone's into it. It's very exciting."

Caton was an assistant captain in his second year, and was prepared to kiss Queen Silver Star at the opening ceremony puck drop – a tournament tradition – if his best friend and captain, Alex McGovern, had been unable to take part

"I bought him some mouthwash and toothpaste as a joke prior to the game," laughed Caton who, along with Woodliffe, joined the Mustangs after Vernon had won the previous three Carnival Classics.

In their first year, 2009, the Mustangs won their opening game against the

Nanaimo Clippers, and didn't win again. They lost the D final, 7-1, to Nanaimo with Woodliffe scoring the only Mustangs goal. Calgary Blades beat Burnaby 9-8 in overtime in the championship. Both teams had been in Vernon's preliminary pool. The tournament also featured a scoring sensation with the Abbotsford Hawks, Jake Virtanen, now starring with the NHL's Vancouver Canucks.

In Year 2, the Mustangs lost their opener, 5-2, to the Edmonton Renegades, then beat Cowichan and the Spokane Jr. Chiefs 5-4 to advance to the semifinals, where they fell 14-0 to the eventual tournament champion Seattle Kent Valley Rainiers, the first American team to win the Classic. Vernon took the B final in 2010, beating the Edmonton Mustangs 6-5.

"I liked playing teams from different places," said Woodliffe. "It's kind of cool to come to the rink and play teams from Alaska or California that you'd probably never play again. That's pretty neat."

Both players are well aware that the biggest change for this year's tournament is the venue, Kal Tire Place North, following the demolition of

the Vernon Civic Arena, home of the previous 47 tournaments.

"It will be a little strange not playing the tournament at the Civic," said Caton, who was in the old wooden bleachers at Civic a couple of years after his Classic experience watching younger brother Grady play for Vernon. "It was always there. I remember going to watch the tournament when I was eight or nine. It was a cool environment. The atmosphere in a rink like that was always great."

For both Woodliffe and Caton, the Classic ranks as their top memory from minor hockey. Both played bantam and midget hockey in Vernon before embarking on junior careers. Caton played for the North Okanagan Knights Junior B team in Armstrong before jumping to Junior A with the Vernon Vipers. After a four-game stint with the Saskatchewan Junior A Hockey League's Humboldt Broncos, Caton returned to the BCHL with the Trail Smoke Eaters, playing three seasons in Trail.

Today, Caton is a freshman forward with the Marian University Sabres in Fond du Lac, Wisc., and NCAA Div. 3 school.

Woodliffe played a year in the KIJHL with the Summerland Steam before jumping to Junior A in Saskatchewan for three seasons with the Weyburn Red Wings. Today, he's a freshman forward with the Northland College Jacks in Ashland, Wisc., playing in the same NCHA Division as Caton.

The two teams met Jan. 25 in Ashland with Woodliffe scoring the game's only goal, shorthanded, in the second period of a 1-0 win over Caton and the Sabres.

"Those two years (in pee wee) were incredible times," said Woodliffe. "It's a time where you decide if you want to keep going. That tournament played a big part, I think, in my love for the game and fulfilling that love, pushing to the next level and wanting to play in front of those crowds again."

Best known for her untiring work with the Vernon & District Minor Hockey Association, Mrs. Myles was a familiar figure around the arena for over 15 years. She was one of the first mothers to start the "Mothers' Auxiliary to Minor Hockey". In April 1965, Minor Hockey said "thank you" to Mrs. Myles by presenting her with a Life Membership in the association. In 1968 the CAHA presented her with a Scroll of Merit in recognition of her outstanding service and dedication to hockey and to the physical and mental development of young Canadians.

Born in Ontario, she moved to Vernon with her husband Dan after the Second World War. She is survived by her husband Dan and one son and daughter.

He was head referee for the North Okanagan Hockey League and in the summer he umpired senior baseball games throughout the valley. His two daughters are carrying on his athletic traditions. Mickey passed away October 18, 1981.

Dan Oxnard was born in Lytton, B.C. August 1944 and moved to Vernon in 1966. He was a professional firefighter for the Vernon Fire Department for 28 years. Ernie and his brother-in-law, Vern Dye, ran the Junior A franchise in Vernon for more than 20 years and the two men used their own vehicles to transport players on road trips.
