





# FUNK FINDING FULFILLMENT

Vernon BC's and Coca-Cola Classic alumni Zac Funk earned the prestigious title of WHL Player of the Month back in September/October 2023 and has been lighting up the WHL ever since.

In the 2015 Coca-Cola Classic, Funk found himself in the "C" final beating out Bow Valley 6-4. And in 2016, Zac and his teammates won the tournament 5-3 over Idaho.

A few years later, Zac rang up 21 goals and 52 points in 28 games with the Yale Hockey Academy Bantam Prep team in Abbotsford and was then taken in Round 2, 43rd overall, by the Calgary Hitmen.

At the age of 20, Funk showcased his exceptional skills by accumulating an impressive 30 points (14 goals, 16 assists) in just 14 games, catapulting him to the top of the WHL scoring charts as the season transitioned into November. His remarkable performance places him first in the league for points and goals.

Expressing humility, Funk attributed his success to the collective efforts of his teammates, stating, "It's an honour to be named Player of the Month. This doesn't happen without my teammates. We are gelling right now, and I think that has really helped with everything, and hopefully, we keep it going."

Funk commenced the season with a stellar start, earning the Tempo WHL Player of the Week title on September 25 after delivering seven points (3 goals, 4 assists) in two games during the opening weekend of the 2023-24 WHL Regular Season.

As a 6-foot, 210-pound right winger, Funk demonstrated consistency with three instances of five-point performances throughout September and October. Notably, he achieved a five-point effort (3 goals, 2 assists) on Friday, September 22,



in a 9-0 victory against Tri-City, another five-point contribution (2 goals, 3 assists) on Friday, October 6, in a 6-4 home triumph over Wenatchee, and a third five-point showcase, securing a hat trick with two assists in a 7-1 victory over the Kamloops Blazers on Saturday, October 21.

In total, Funk has delivered eight multi-point performances in the first 14 games of the season.

From October 4 to October 21. Funk enjoyed a six-game pointscoring streak, accumulating 17 points (9 goals, 8 assists). Impressively, he leads the WHL in power-play goals with nine.

This season marks Funk's first full season with the Cougars since his acquisition by Prince George at the 2023 WHL Trade Deadline. In 45 career WHL Regular Season games with the Cougars, he has amassed 56 points (27 goals, 29 assists) and a plus-26 rating. During the 2023 WHL Playoffs, Funk contributed eight points (5 goals, 3 assists) in 10 games.

Originally selected by the Calgary Hitmen in the second round (43rd overall) of the 2018 WHL Draft, Funk has tallied an impressive 177 points (94 goals, 83 assists) in 200 career WHL Regular Season games.

As of November, the Prince George Cougars lead the WHL with a record of 10-4-0-0, standing as the highest-scoring team in the league with 74 goals in 14 games (5.29 goals per game). Thanks in part to Funk's contributions, the Cougars boast the top-ranked power play in the WHL, converting on 36.1 percent of their opportunities.

Funk notched his sixth hat-trick of the season and 40th goal, lifting the Cats to a 6-2 win over the Wenatchee Wild at the Town Toyota Center on Jan 3rd.

As of Jan 28th 2024, Funk has 78 points with 43 goals, 35 assists, is +33, 49 PIM, 21 Power play goals, 5 game winning goals and averaging 1.66 PTS/G with the Prince George Cougars.



# HISTORY OF TROPHIES/AWARDS



#### **AMY MYLES** TROPHY **'A'' DIVISION WINNER**

Best known for her untiring work with the Vernon & District Minor Hockey Association, Mrs. Myles was a familiar figure around the arena for over 15 years. She was one of the first mothers to start the "Mothers' Auxiliary to Minor Hockey". In April 1965, Minor Hockey said "thank you" to Mrs. Myles by presenting her with a Life Membership in the association. In 1968 the CAHA presented

her with a Scroll of Merit in recognition of her outstanding service and dedication to hockey and to the physical and mental development of young Canadians.



#### **ALEX KULY** TROPHY **"B" DIVISION WINNER**

Born and raised in Portage La Prairie, Manitoba, Alex Kuly played Junior Hockey with the Portage Terriers before joining the Flin Flon Bombers defense. During the war, he served in the Air Force as a physical education instructor, later returning to play defense for the Bombers. Kuly also played defense for Kamloops and coached in Vernon for one season. He served as the head referee for the Okanagan Mainline Minor Hockey

Association before being transferred to Quesnel as the Forest Ranger. In Quesnel, he coached the Kangaroos. Kuly returned to Vernon in 1961, remaining a dedicated supporter of Minor Hockey.



#### MICKEY MCMAHON TROPHY "C" DIVISION WINNER

Born in Nelson and raised in Revelstoke, Mickey McMahon arrived in Vernon in 1951, working as a Telegrapher for the CPR. His passion for sports and love of hockey led him to join Minor Hockey in 1968. Managing the pup division and Pee Wee rep teams, he, along with coach Walt Trentini, guided the team to victory in the "A" Division in 1973 and "B" Division in 1974. Born in Lytton, B.C., in August 1944, Dan Oxnard relocated to Vernon in 1966. In 1975, Dan became involved in Minor Hockey, contributing 12 years as a coach, team manager, and in executive roles, including Director, Vice President, and

President. Always ready to lend a hand, Dan played a crucial role in the Pee Wee Hockey tournament committee from 1985, shaping its success over the next 8 years.



#### ERNIE KOWAL MEMORIAL AWARD **COACH'S AWARD**

Active in Junior A and minor hockey in Vernon since 1958, Ernie Kowal, known as 'Esso Ernie,' played diverse roles, including coach, manager, vice-president, and president in the Vernon Minor Hockey Association. Additionally, he co-owned the B.C. Junior Hockey League's Vernon Essos. As a volunteer firefighter and former RCMP Auxiliary force member, Ernie passed away on December 12, 1997, at 63. Survived by his son

# CHERKOWSKI NAMED NCHA - STAR OF THE WEEK

A Vernon Mustang Alumni player was honoured with the first star of the week Dec. 12, 2023 for his play in the National Collegiate Hockey Association (NCHA).

Nicholas Cherkowski was given the award after five points in two games. The junior forward plays for the Marian University Sabres in Indianapolis. He scored once and had four helpers in a two game sweep of Concordia Moorhead. Four of his points came in the second game, where he registered a goal and three assists in the first two periods of the team's 5-3 victory.

Currently, Cherkowski is ninth in league scoring, with 14 points (six goals, eight assists) in 13 games.

The 23-year-old grew up playing in the Vernon Minor Hockey Association and playing in The Classic in 2013. Nicholas shared The Classic program cover in 2020 with his sister Anne Cherkowski, who also played in the tournament in 2014. She brought home a silver medal at the 2019 Women's World Under 18 Hockey Championships in Slovakia. After the Classic, Nicholas started playing for the Pursuit of Excellence minor hockey association, before playing parts of three seasons for the hometown Vernon Vipers. He was traded to the Wenatchee Wild in the 2019-20 season, and then shipped to the Chilliwack Chiefs in that season.

In 2020-21, Cherkowski had a cup of coffee with the AJHL's Calgary Canucks before committing with Marian University.

In his NCHA career through three seasons, he has accumulated 43 points in 66 games.

The Sabres are currently just 2-6 for ninth in the 10-team conference.




