Cosmo Wilson and Deagan McMillan both jumpstarted their hockey paths by enjoying huge success in the Coca-Cola Classic Pee Wee Invitational Hockey Tournament.

Having back-to-back Classic titles in 17' & 18', the Vernon minor hockey products used that early glory preparing them for the Western Hockey League, considered the No. 1 junior league in North American.

They each celebrated their 20th birthday in January and are clutch veterans on their respective Major Junior teams.

Wilson rang up one goal and 11 points in 61 games as a shutdown blueliner with the Ed Chynoweth Cup champion Moose Jaw Warriors. He pocketed 2+3 in 56 rookie season games.

"They held a parade for us which was a lot of fun," said Wilson, a right-shot who wears No. 12. "We got our rings which are pretty big."

Wilson was a big part of the Warriors' playoff run which included an epic seven-game semifinal series win over the Saskatoon Blades. Six of the games went to overtime. The Warriors swept the Portland Winterhawks in the Cup final. Moose Jaw failed to make the Memorial Cup final, falling 5-4 to the host Saginaw Spirit in preliminary play

A self-described two-way, stay-athome d-man, Wilson says Moose Jaw superstar Brayden Yagr, who captained Team Canada at the last world juniors, is a natural leader whose presence was big in the playoffs.

"Yagr is a great player and a great guy. He's not vocal. It's more his work ethic that everybody follows."

Yagr was traded to the Lethbridge Hurricanes in December, the Warriors receiving two players and six draft picks.

Wilson, in his fourth year, also

experienced trade central in the offseason when he was sent to the Victoria Royals in exchange for Deagan Kinniburgh and two draft choices.

"It's going pretty good here," said Wilson, a six-foot, 170-pounder. "Good weather and it's a great city."

His memories of the Coca-Cola tournament are all positive. In one tourney title, Cosmo's father, was the coach.

"The parade was pretty good. I remember there was one game when they let all the schools in and they packed the old Civic (Arena)."







# VERNON PRODUCTS LOVING THE DUB

Victoria GM Jake Heisinger was over-the-top when he obtained Wilson.

"Cosmo played an important role for Moose Jaw down the stretch enroute to a WHL championship and a Memorial Cup appearance," penned Heisinger, on the Royals' website. "Being able to add a player that brings championship experience to our group will be beneficial both on and off the ice."

McMillan was briefly teammates again with Wilson after going to Victoria for eight games before the Royals dispatched him to the Wenatchee Wild. McMillan, also in his fourth year, racked

> up 36 goals and 57 points in 170 games with the Tri-City Americans.

McMillan was ranked 108th by NHL Central Scouting in his draft year (2023). The 6-foot-2, 193-pounder went undrafted but attended the Toronto Maple Leafs' development camp that summer. He played for the Vancouver Canucks in the Young Stars Tournament last September in Penticton.

"Everything happens for a reason," said Deagan, on being trade bait. "I feel I will be able to help the team. I play wing for the most part and I just have to keep shooting."

YouTube features three dazzling goals by McMillan on a hat-trick night in The Dub.

Rubbing elbows with NHL players and prospects had McMillan wanting more as he further refines his game. He cited the Toronto camp as "definitely big-boy-hockey."

While Victoria owned McMillan's rights for about 10 minutes, Heisinger was high on McMillan's skill-set before sending him to Wenatchee for Austin Zemlak and a pair of draft picks. McMillan was originally traded from Tri-City to Victoria for Hayden Moore.

"We felt we needed to add to our top 6 and forward group and to do, we had to move a really good player and person in Austin. Deagan can play both centre and wing and adds skill and grit to our lineup."

McMIllan loves following the ways of head coach Don Nauchbar, who

brings a no-nonsense style to the game. Nauchbar, 65, put up 468 PIM and 69 points in 223 NHL games.

"He's a great coach. He pushes you. He's old style. He likes the fights, the hits and the board battles."

McMillan, who wears No. 17 and is a right shot, also thinks fondly about the Coca-Cola Classic, where he was part two titles.

"I remember the parade was awesome and the guest speakers at the banquet were great. They were all former NHL players."

#### **AMY MYLES** TROPHY "A" DIVISION WINNER

Mrs. Myles was a dedicated member of the Vernon & District Minor Hockey Association, contributing over 15 years of service. As a founding member of the "Mothers' Auxiliary to Minor Hockey," she became a beloved figure in the community. In 1965, she was awarded a Life Membership in recognition of her tireless efforts.
